ASSESSMENT POLICY

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to:

- Provide clear guidelines on the approach at India International School to formative and summative assessment
- Establish a consistent and coherent approach to recording summative assessment outcomes and reporting to parents
- Clearly set out how, and when, assessment practice will be monitored and evaluated

PRINCIPLES

India International School's expectations for teaching, learning and assessment are grounded in the principles of academic integrity and excellence. Assessment includes any examination, practical demonstration, performance or product that allows students to demonstrate the objectives as described by the syllabus. Assessment should be:

- aligned with curriculum and pedagogy
- equitable for all students
- evidence-based, using established standards and continue to make defensible and comparable judgments about students' learning
- **ongoing**, with a range and balance of evidence compiled over time to reflect the depth and breadth of students' learning
- transparent, to enhance professional and public confidence in the processes used, the information obtained and the decisions made
- informative of where students are in their learning.
- High-quality assessment which is characterized by three attributes:
 - ✓ validity, through alignment with what is taught, learnt and assessed
 - ✓ accessibility, so that each student is given opportunities to demonstrate what they
 know and can do
 - ✓ reliability, so that assessment results are consistent, dependable or repeatable.











ASSESSMENT IN KINDERGARTEN:

- Young children show their understanding by doing, showing and telling.
 Teachers use assessment strategies by observing, listening, and asking probing questions in order to assess and evaluate children's achievement.
- Assessment is the gathering of information through observable evidence of what a child can do, say, and apply, it involves the judging and interpreting of the assessment data to determine the child's progress in achieving overall learning.
- We at kindergarten observe, monitor, document, and assess children's learning and regularly report on children's progress towards the achievements and expectations to parents and the children.
- The methods used for assessing and evaluating children's learning is clearly
 identified and based on learning expectation. Assessments are frequently planned
 and organized to assist child in progressing towards achievement of the overall
 expectations.
- The main focus of assessment is on informal diagnostic assessment of prior
 learning and on formative assessment that is intended to support ongoing learning.
 Throughout the Kindergarten year, teacher will observe and record child's learning
 and progress in relation to the expectations for the seven learning areas included
 in the Kindergarten Program.

PROCEDURE:

Assessment is carried by collecting individual progress weekly and monthly using various assessment tools and techniques as given below;

- Anecdotal records
- Online trackers
- Index papers
- Checklist
- Activity's sheets
- Conferencing



ASSESSMENT PROGRAM

Primary-I (Grade 1 to 3):

Students are assessed on the basis of continuous and comprehensive evaluation and not through term-end examinations. Assessment involves various techniques like class test, Quizzes, Poem recitation, poster making, puzzles, etc

- **4. GK, Computer and Moral Science** will be assessed on the basis of class tests and activities.

Discipline of each student will be assessed on the basis of his/her attendance, sincerity, behavior, values tidiness, respectfulness for rules and regulations, attitude towards society, nation and others.

Secondary (Grade 9 to 10)

I. Each student will be evaluated according to annual assessment scheme which comprises written tests, Subject Enrichment Activities and note book submission for each subject. Assessment structure for five main subjects can be summarized as given below;

Each student will be assessed on the basis of his/her behaviour as per Article 5 of the Ministerial Resolution No.(619) of 2017, concerning Students' Behaviour Management Bylaw in Public Educational Institutions.

Behaviour Marks will be awarded for each term and average will be expressed in a numerical value of 100 marks at the end of the scholastic year. The breakup of 100 marks will be as per the table given below:

Outstanding Behaviour*- It includes Personal development, appreciating the values of Islam, respecting the identity, heritage and culture of the UAE and the cultures of the world, and social responsibility, leadership skills and innovation

Positive behaviour**- It is the expected behaviour of each student, and is negatively affected by the deduction of marks according to the behavior and irregularities, though the deducted marks can be regained in case that the student acquires the positive behaviour.
